"When my mother died, it was very hard for me," Budilovsky said.

Budilovsky shared her mother's struggle in Poland during World War I in the book, "Helena." She tells the story of her mother

witnessing horror in the war but then finding the strength to come to America to start a new life.

Budilovsky said family is the inspiration for all of books. And in turn, she has inspired her family to write their own stories.

"We have discovered that every single person, young and old, have incredible stories to tell," said Joan Budilovsky, Leona's daughter. Joan has written several books herself including "The Complete Idiot's Guide to Massage."

Joan said she continues to be influenced by her mom while enjoying motherhood herself.

"Her honesty, integrity, humor, wit, her protective nature, giving me the sense and reality of knowing that I am loved ... I hope I am giving this to my son," Joan said.
